Advantage After School Program

Open enrollment for the 2009-2010 school year!

Cornell Cooperative Extension sponsors Advantage After School Programs in Keene Central School, AuSable Forks Elementary, and Keeseville Elementary Schools. The program provides a snack, educational activities, homework assistance, and socialization opportunities for enrollees.

The program is for students in grades K-6 and runs from dismissal until 5:30 p.m., (6:00 p.m. in Keene) Monday through Friday, when school is in session. We do not operate on early release days, school vacation days, or select staff development days.

The goal of the After School Program is to improve socialization skills, and improve students' relationships with their schools, their communities, and each other.

Activities include: fitness and nutrition education, safety and prevention, gardening and nature, literacy activities, arts and crafts, 4-H science projects, safety activities, and character education.

The program costs \$40.00/month for one child, \$60.00/month for two children, and \$90.00/month for 3 children enrolled per household. Full and partial scholarships are available, and county childcare subsidies are also accepted.

A program manager, site coordinator, and program assistants provide activities and oversee daily operations. The program is a licensed school-age childcare facility and complies with all regulations defined by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services.

The program is funded by The Advantage Program through the Office of Children and Family Services, and is administered by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Essex County in partnership with the AuSable Valley Central School District.
